
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


Key Action 1: Learning mobility of individuals



ERASMUS+ 2014-2020

Total budget: €14.7 billion, 40% budget increase



- >2 million higher education student
- >800,000 staff of all fields
- ▶ **135,000** student & staff exchanges with partner countries
- **≥25,000** scholarships for Joint Master degrees
- >200,000 Master student loans



Key Action 1: Learning mobility of individuals





- All levels of higher education (Short cycle, Bachelor, Master, Doctoral levels)
 - + recent graduates + all disciplines
- > **3-12 months** for studies
- 2-12 months for traineeships (not open to partner countries in first 2 years)
- Each student can benefit up to 12 months per study cycle







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- Sending mobility to programme countries
- Sending and receiving mobility to/from partner countries (no NAs in Partner Countries)
- Individually or within consortia extended to all types of mobility



Student degree mobility: Student loan guarantee





For students in programme countries who want to follow a full Master degree abroad

Can borrow up to 12,000€ for a one-year Master, 18,000€ for a two-year Master

Nearly 200,000
Master students will
benefit from this
loan over 7 years

Favorable entry & pay-back terms

Students should address themselves to selected national banks or student loan agencies

Main features

Policy Experimentations (new)

Led by **Ministries**developing and implementing field trials in cooperation with evaluators and stakeholders

- Links to Open Method of Coordination and CSRs
- Rigorous evaluation methods
- Trans-national development and evaluation / National trials
- Up-scaling through systemic (governmental) reform

Forward-looking cooperation projects

(based on past EU good practice)

Led by **major stakeholders** developing innovative policy approaches

- Links to Open Method of Coordination
- Representative stakeholders capable of influencing the policy agenda
- Focus on emerging issues
- Mainstreaming at institution/organisation level
