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MEnS: the French network for migrants in HER



(AUF datas, June 2017)

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- Launched in September 2017
- Number of students: ca. 2000
- Budget 2018: 3,7M€ for French courses

of which: 0,46M€ of public funding (AUF)

38 universities are members of MEnS (out of 75)

What is done by the universities?

- French courses
- Welcome-package with assistance for all administrative issues (universities and beyond)
- Free registration at the university
- Accommodation and social assistance
- Integration into campus life
- Career advising

Aims of MEnS:

- Better integrate refugees students in HER and the society
- Be part of a network of actors on migration
- Share good (best?) practices
- Be the "voice" of the universities and act at a political level
- Change the way people look at migrants
- Work together with other universities, associations and networks in Europe and in the world to achieve our mission

MEnS: new achievements

Some achievements of MEnS:

- Creation of a national diploma for the integration of refugees in HER (with a national recognition – Ministry of HER)
- Give refugees students access to social grants (8M€ this year)
- Constructive collaboration with the DIAIR
- Position universities as actors in the agreements between cities and the State on integration of refugees
- Launch our **website** and communication
- Participation to the events of the Refugee day on June 20th
- Together with AUF, increase the dotation of the Ministry of HER for the French courses in universities (+ 200k€ this year)



MEnS: a work in progress...

Still (hard) work to do...

- Recognition of prior learning / diplomas
- Integration at the **right level of study** (and determination of this level...!)
- Intensify positive communication on refugees ("story telling")
- Organise training seminars for university staff about refugees, their rights, their situation
- Promote refugees' access to « regulated » professions (lawyer, doctor, notary...)
- Concentrate efforts on asylum seekers (which are excluded of official policies in France)
- Increase the **financial support** of public and private institutions
- Do alliances with other networks in Europe

Opportunities:

- Continuity at the head of the French
- Ministry
- New Erasmus+ program to be discussed and launched

Threats:

- French and European political context is difficult
- Migration crisis decreases
- Money is scarce
- Some people in universities get discouraged
- Lots of Erasmus programs reach their end
